Day 01

Arrive Delhi

Arrive at Delhi International Airport. Once you clear immigrations, collect baggage, and exit the customs area, you will be met by Liberty India representative who will transfer you to hotel & will assist on check in.

Day 02

In Delhi

Morning at leisure.

Afternoon, proceed for a tour of **New Delhi** - the new capital designed by Sir Edward Lutyens. Drive past the **Presidential Palace**, the Rashtrapati Bhavan and the secretariat buildings - the centre of all government activity and down the main avenue, the impressive **Rajpath** to the World War I memorial arch, the **India Gate**, the **High Court Building** and the **Old Fort**. Visit **Humayun's Tomb** built in 1565 AD by his grieving widow Haji Begum, the **Qutub Minar**, 72 metres high and the ruins of Quwat-ul-Eslam (Light of Islam) Mosque. See Delhi's most curious antique, the uncorroded Iron Pillar, which dates back to the 4th century AD.



Overnight in Delhi

Day 03

In Delhi

After breakfast, proceed for unique yet fascinating experience of Old Delhi. Visit The magnificent **Red Fort** (Closed on Mondays) - built of red sandstone dates from the very peak of the Mughal power. Within its walls are marble palaces and a grand audience chamber, the Diwan-i-Khas, where Moghul emperors held court and the Peacock Throne once stood. The **Jama Masjid** - India's largest mosque and **Raj Ghat** - the memorial to Mahatma Gandhi. Disembark at the Red Fort where a **Cycle Rickshaw** will be arranged. The thrill of being driven through the narrow, winding lanes is a memorable experience.



Rest of the day at leisure.

Overnight in Delhi

Day 04

Drive Delhi - Agra - Jaipur

Early morning, transfer to New Delhi railway station to take your Shatabdi Express train to Agra.

Depart Delhi

0615 hrs

Shatabdi Express

Arrive Agra

0810 hrs



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Meet on arrival at Agra railway station & proceed to visit **Taj Mahal** - the greatest love story ever told. On the death of his beloved wife Mumtaz Mahal, in wild extravagance, Shahjehan built her this memorial. 20,000 men laboured for over 17 years to build this wealth of white marble and precious stone.



Visit **Agra Fort** - behind its forbidding red sandstone battlements laid palaces that tell the story of the Moghul Empire. The most impressive part of the Fort is the Dewan-e-Am, where the Emperor sat on his throne to dispense to his subjects, and the Dewan-e-Khas where he received foreign dignitaries. A brief visit is also made to the marble inlay workshop- where one can see the art that went into the inlay work at the Taj Mahal. This workshop has brought back into India this almost forgotten art style.

Thereafter, transfer to Agra railway station to take your Shatabdi Express train to Jaipur.

Meet on arrival at Jaipur railway station & transfer to hotel.

Overnight in Jaipur

Day 05

In Jaipur

After having breakfast at the hotel visit **Amber Fort** – situated 7 miles north of Jaipur with its a honey-colored fortress-palace in the Aravalli Hills which can be mounted by Jeep. It has been described as “the sleeping beauty of Rajasthan”. The sombre exterior belies the richness of the royal apartments which open on to striking views of the gorge.

Thereafter, enjoy city tour of Jaipur which is the city which has the “tone of the autumn sunset”. Visit **Hawa Mahal (Palace of Winds)** an elaborate building encrusted with delicate honeycomb screens and carved balconies from which the royal ladies, confined to their quarters, could view the world outside. **Jai Singh’s Observatory** built in the 17th century by the founder of Jaipur who, besides being a prince was also soldier, astronomer and builder. **City Palace** now a museum contains fine Rajput and Moghul paintings, rare manuscripts and an armoury.



Evening, enjoy **Elephant safari** followed by a private Dinner at private venue called **Dera Amer**.

Overnight in Jaipur

Day 06

In Jaipur

This day, visit **Sanganer**, is renowned for its crafts and hand-printed textiles. It’s the largest center of the handmade paper industry. It manufactures the supreme quality of handmade papers and hand printed textiles by using units of block and



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screen printers. Traditional small floral prints form the specialty of Sanganer block printers. One can explore the Kagazi Mohalla of Sanganer, which is prominent for expert artisans. These artisans are known as 'Kagazis' and observing these artisans making lovely patterns on fabrics with block-prints, will definitely please the visitor.

Thereafter, enjoy **Cycle Rickshaw ride** in market and walk around the Old city, OR discover the many shopping attractions of this city, or to just laze by the poolside!

In the evening, visit **Chokhi Dhani village**, it has been the mirror of Rajasthani culture since 1989. Started as part of ambiance for a restaurant, over the years it has evolved as a tasteful and authentic symbol of ethnic village life of this most colorful state in the country. Today, the name of Chokhi Dhani is synonymous with Rajasthani culture throughout the country.



Overnight in Jaipur

Day 07

Jaipur – Jodhpur (330 kms / 6 hrs)

After breakfast, drive to **Jodhpur**. The city of Jodhpur, with its gentle atmosphere belies a stormy yet glorious past. Its walls, seven gates and numerous bastions and towers were built in the 16th century by Rao Maldeo. In its maze of old lanes lie several palaces, havelis and some temples. The famous puppet makers of Jodhpur are found here. 393 feet above the flat surrounding plains soars a bold bluff on which was built the massive **Meherangarh (Majestic) Fort**.

Arrive Jodhpur and check in at hotel.

This afternoon, visit the **fort and palaces**, some of which contain a fine collection of Rajput miniature paintings, a museum, **Maan Vilas** which houses Rathore armoury and on the ramparts stand cannons, the spoils of Gaj Singh. Visit **Mehrangarh Fort**, dominates the city and is the largest fort in all Rajasthan. Founded in 1458 as the site of Rao Jodha's new capital hence the name, Jodhpur, the city has grown around it, and in the 500 years that have passed the fort has never been taken by force.

Jaswant Thada, 1 km downhill from Mehrangarh (easily walked). Royal cenotaphs built in marble, with a picturesque location next to a little lake.

Overnight in Jodhpur

Day 08

Jodhpur - Udaipur

After breakfast, enjoy **Jeep Safari** to **Bishnoi Village**. The Bishnoi's are a eco Friendly sect of Hindu religion, it is one of the different community of Rajasthan who are famous for their rich cultural, Rajasthani Life and there true love for nature and animals. Bishnoi Village Safari is the organization started by Rajas and Maharaja's of Jodhpur to show that Indian and foreign guest a glimpse of rich cultural life around their state of Marwar, A **True Rajasthan**.





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Thereafter proceed for Udaipur (5hrs drive), en route visits the Jain Marble temples at **Ranakpur**, the most magnificent **Jain temples** in India. It is an extensive complex covering 3,600 sq. meters and has 29 halls with 1,444 pillars, each unlike the other, intricately covered with delicate carvings. The central temple is dedicated to Adinath, the revealer of Truth.

Arrive Udaipur and check in at hotel.

Overnight in Udaipur

Day 09

Udaipur - Mumbai

After Breakfast City tour of Udaipur - Visit the **City Palace**, once the home of Mewar's rulers, is today a museum. It consists of several flawlessly integrated palaces which overlook the clear blue of Lake Pichola. The **Crystal Gallery** at the Fateh Prakash Palace hotel is also a must. Visit **Sahelion-ki-bari** – the cluster of gardens built by different rulers over a period of time, for the women of the family.



Afternoon, transfer to Udaipur airport to take your flight to Mumbai.

Overnight in Mumbai

Day 10

In Mumbai

Start this day with your visit to **Gateway of India**, built to commemorate the visit of George V and Queen Mary in 1911. Drive, past the Venetian gothic style old **Secretariat**, the University Convocation Hal, The Rajabai Clock tower, **The High Court** in early English Gothic Style. Visit **Prince of Wales Museum**, vegetable & fruit section at **Crawford market**, **Victoria Terminus railway station**, to view the **Dabawala** system (time permitting), it's a person in Mumbai whose job is to carry and deliver freshly made food from home in lunch boxes to office workers. Tiffin is an old-fashioned English word for a light lunch, and sometimes for the box it is carried in.



Afternoon, continue to visit **Mani Bhavan- a museum showing the "Freedom Movement" of India** after which guests visit at the **"Dhobi Ghat"** a well known open air laundromat in Mumbai. The washers, locally known as Dhobis, work in the open to wash the clothes. There are rows of open-air concrete wash pens, each fitted with its own flogging stone. Called the world's largest outdoor laundry.





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Day 11

Mumbai - Home

In time, transfer to Mumbai International airport to take your return flight back to home. This day your room will be held till 1200 noon.
